
#### Freedom and independence

# "Social Contract" with the Free Software Community

- 1. Debian will remain 100% free
- 2. We will give back to the free software community
- 3. We will not hide problems
- 4. Our priorities are our users and free software
- 5. Works that do not meet our free software standards although non-

free works are not a part of Debian, we support their use and provide infrastructure for non-free packages (such as our bug tracking system and mailing lists).

# The Debian Free Software Guidelines (DFSG)

- 1. Free Redistribution
- 2. Source Code
- 3. Derived Works
- 4. Integrity of The Author's Source Code
- 5. No Discrimination Against Persons or Groups
- 6. No Discrimination Against Fields of Endeavor
- 7. Distribution of License
- 8. License Must Not Be Specific to Debian
- 9. License Must Not Contaminate Other Software

**10. Example Licenses -** The "GPL", "BSD", and "Artistic" licenses are examples of licenses that we consider "free".




